It seems that anything goes in our own studios, and that is part of the joy of quilting—learning a variety of methods and techniques, then incorporating them into our quilts however we want. A little patchwork here, a little improv there, add some collage, and top with some applique. Sounds like fun to me! I hope you are enjoying a chance to combine and explore your own designs, whatever "type" they are, and will share them at our guild meetings!

Clustered Spires Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes June 10, 2021

Our virtual Zoom meeting was hosted by Sandy Dunning, and following chat room visits, the meeting began at 7:00pm with the introduction of our speaker by Fran Scher.

Our quest speaker, Heather Kojan, a modern quilter of traditional roots, has been sewing for over 25 years and enjoys teaching and lecturing. Heather founded the Baltimore Modern Quilt Guild and has contributed patterns articles to books and magazines – Classic Modern Quilts, The Improv Handbook for Modern Quilters, 50 Little Gifts, 100 Blocks, Modern Patchwork and Curated Quilts. Heather’s presentation of “Quilt Remix, Fresh Ideas For Stale Projects”, gave us valuable advice and inspiration on how to deal with our UFO’s, orphan quilts, and use of scraps. The presentation ended with examples of Heather’s use of scraps, almost exclusively, in her quilts.

Our business meeting began at 8:00, Danita Frisby presiding. We had 27 members attending. Minutes from the previous meeting were posted in the May Newsletter and with no additions or corrections, were accepted as posted.

Committee Reports:

- Block of the Month: Kathy Shankle said the July Block is “Baby Bud” from Quilters Cache (Quilterscache.com).
- Fran Scher told us about the Bernina 1260 donated to the guild which is for sale to members by bids with minimum bid of \$200.00 with sale closing on June 30th. Fran emailed details on the machine to all members.
- Nancy Speck reported the opportunity quilt is progressing with applique completed and pieced side sections. A quilter has been chosen and backing has been purchased.
- Danita called for volunteers for the Marketing Committee which she now chairs. Ideas for on-line sales are needed for the opportunity quilt.
- Karen Smith announced the November meeting will be in-person at the Delaplaine with extended social time. Please bring snacks to share.
- Our Christmas meeting will be December 9th with Karen Smith chairing with help from Sandy Dunning and Kathy Shankle. They will have a July 1st zoom meeting for theme. More information on the banquet will be in the July newsletter.
- Fran gave updates from the Program Committee with reminder of September workshop by Debbie Kratochvil teaching Pickle Dish (Modern Wedding Ring) with easy paper piecing. Eight members have signed up, but more are needed for the \$20.00 workshop via zoom. The workshop will be opened to other guilds on July 1st.
- Our workshop on feed sacks was moved to 2022 as the speaker does not do Zoom.
- Karen Smith is the new chair of the Program Committee.
- Karen said the July meeting will be a sit n’sew with emphasis on fidget mat construction as more are needed for the Homewood Dementia Unit.
- Karen said Kay Rice will chair the Community Service Committee, and the Faith House is good on quilts, but fidget mats are needed for Homewood. Ogle’s presentation on fidget mat construction is on the guild website.
- Darlene Morris reported there a still a number of unpaid members. A special incentive is being offered to unpaid members. June 30th is the cutoff date for 2021 renewal. The website password will be changed on June 30th.

- Sandy Dunning said the member directory with updates will be published on July 1st. Please send her all updates including new head shots, new and old members.
- Nancy Speck asked if Community Service donations should be turned in now. Karen answered that Kay will collect before October 1st and the presentation will be virtual.
- Jacque Janss inquired if any member other than Olga Schrichte does longarm quilting. Jessica Halpern will do donation quilts free as practice as will Fran Scher, both being new longarmers. Marcie does pantograph quilting and offered her services for donation quilts.

Ten members participated in Show and Tell.

Door Prizes were won by Mary Pauley – a pattern, Clay Court by Sassafra Designs, donated by Webfabrics; and Kathy Cramer won a gift card from Charlotte’s Cottage.

Danita passed the president’s gavel (and bell) to Fran Scher.

A heartfelt “Thank You” to Danita for her steady unwavering guidance through the Covid months.

Old Business

Virtual vs In-Person Meetings – We learned that given the lapse in time, the Delaplaine has rented the meeting space to someone else for the second Thursdays in September and October, so we cannot begin in-person meetings until November. Plans have been made for virtual meetings in any case through September. August will be a community service workshop, and Deborah Kratoivil is scheduled for September. It was agreed that the Challenge and Community Service presentations can be handled virtually they were last year. There was a discussion of November and as a “welcome back”, adding a Thanksgiving meal to the program presentation by a Native American speaker. Karen Smith, Chair of the Banquet Committee, is getting her committee started and could begin to plan for this, possibly with hors d’oeuvres, desserts, and wine, beginning early at 6. There could be new members once we get back in-person. If new members join later in the year the usual dues proration will apply.

Linda Beavers agreed for refreshments that she will put out a notice for refreshment signups beginning in November.

Miscellaneous – It is not clear yet if the Delaplaine will do its Christmas Expo this year. They will let us know. The cost would be \$75 for a space and we would keep 100% of the income. We could also put items in their gift shop with a percentage of the proceeds to the Delaplaine.

Amazon Smiles - Karen Smith reminded everyone of this program. Members who purchase on Amazon can click on Amazon Smiles to designate a percentage of their spending for donation to the guild. She will also bring this up at the next meeting.

Old Business

Bernina sewing machine - A Bernina 1260 machine has been donated to the guild. This a 1995 machine. It works nicely but has a few repair needs. It was suggested that it be fixed up and sold as a silent auction with a \$200 minimum (with some items missing, it is thought to be worth about \$500). Fran will do an email blast to members with a July 1 deadline, and check with Treasurer Robin Rippeon about receiving bids.

FSK Lions Club Request – This group has asked if the guild would create a quilt for them that would be used by them as a fundraiser. They would fund supplies up to \$650. This will be referred to Kay Rice and the Community Service Committee for future consideration as we already have Community Service commitments for this year. Danita will check with the club about their timing. It will be brought up at the meeting to see if any individual would like to take on the project.

Committee Review – Danita suggested that the guild consider combining some of its committees since we have so many given the size of our guild. She suggested, as an example, merging Membership and Hospitality or possibly putting together all of the media functions. Fran Scher, incoming President, was asked to consider this with the Vice-President Kathy Shankle and Sandy Dunning to develop a plan.

Go-Daddy Website Backup Costs – Fran Scher indicated that she needed to respond to our website provider to assure a backup copy of our platform, personally paying the \$114.10 cost. The necessity for this was noted and reimbursement approved. Fran advised that the total cost for our system, including the site, security and back-up, is \$379.

Committee Reports

Opportunity Quilt – Nancy Speck advised that she is working with Brenda Barnhardt and is making progress on completing the quilt.

Quilt Marketing – Danita Frisby has agreed to chair this committee. She is getting started on marketing, considering the Delaplaine event in December. It is not clear what other of our traditional venues will be available. She will play it by ear and also explore some different approaches.

Block of the Month – Kathy Shankle advised that the blocks for the rest of the year will continue to be selected from Quilter's Cache.

Community Service – Kay Rice reported that we are well ahead of our goals in most categories.

Facebook – In response to a question, Karen Smith said that she would check out the possibility of an Instagram account.

Publicity – Brenda Barnhardt suggested that we put the notice of our Zoom meetings in the newspaper.

Membership – It was suggested that the guild encourage members whose membership has lapsed during the pandemic to return as we begin in-person meetings in November, with a proration of dues. Membership Chair, Darlene Morris, indicated that she will be sending out reminder notices and include this information, as well as a reminder of a June 30 deadline for dues payment to be in the directory and have access to the member website information.

Programs – Outgoing Chair, Fran Scher, advised that the new chair of this committee is Karen Smith, a current committee member who has been very involved in program development. Fran indicated that the 2022 contracts are completed at a cost of \$2,675, a little below the authorized amount of \$3,000. A few fill-in items are still needed. Some meetings are still virtual as are both planned workshops. She will check with Treasurer and Guild Historian Robin Rippeon about whether the old files need to be retained.

Sunshine – Chair Olga Schricte reported that member Marcia Walker will be having surgery on Friday, and that Nancy Pedersen continues to face various issues. She also noted that Dennis Vernon had sent a really nice “Thank You” for guild responses on the death of guild member Gale Vernon.

Website – It was noted that the password for the membership section of the website will be changed as of June 30.



We had 27 members present at our June quilt guild (Zoom) meeting.



BLOCK OF THE MONTH - JULY

The BOM for July is titled Lady of the Lake 2. The link to this block on Quilter's Cache is: <https://www.quilterscache.com/L/LadyoftheLake2Block.html>. This one is much different than the traditional Lady of the Lake block.

I chose this block because you can make it in scrappy colors OR in a three-color choice. When making a quilt with this block, a secondary block appears in the design. The pinwheel center provides much movement. A suggested layout using eight of these blocks on point is shown on page 2 of the instructions.

Speaker's Notes, June 10, 2021 Meeting

Heather Kojan's subject, Quilt Remix, was certainly fresh ideas for stale projects. Whether you call them UFO, WIG, WISP, PIGS or PHD'S (Projects Half Done), we all have them by starting more than we can finish, losing interest, being stuck on directions, pattern too hard, ran out of fabric, taste changed, or reason has passed for project, they are there waiting for us. Which brings us to "do they all need to be finished"? Of course, not, maybe shopping is the hobby. Remember, the kids don't want them.

Heather suggested steps we can take to lessen or deal with our UFO collection:

- Evaluate whether to finish or use in another project or reform
- Organize with lists to finish, notes on next step, put materials together and move forward one step at a time
- Closet method
- Downsize the collection


