CSQG MEETING MINUTES - May 11, 2023

Fran Scher opened the meeting at 6:45pm with 37 in attendance. We welcomed 2 new members, Lidia Borquez and Sheila Peters, and 2 quests, Lisa Huffman and Jane Hammond.

Fran thanked Linda McNey and Jennifer Chua for being the guild's Secretaries for the past two years. Then, Marty Simmons announced the candidates for the President and Secretary. Lynne McCracken was voted as the next Secretary, as was Jessica Halpin as the next President by unanimous votes. Their 2-year terms begin following the June guild meeting. Congratulations Jessica and Lynne.

Marty announced that she will be stepping down as Chair of the Community Service Committee by the end of May. Jennifer will be taking over as Chair. Marty thanked Kate Lane for the completion of a successful pillowcase project. 65 pillowcases were made in total and given to Frederick Health for Camp Jamie. Three-yard fabric bundle giveaways are still available for members who sign up to sew a quilt for the Stockman Institute. There are also cat hammock quilt kits and cat pad kits available.

Sandy Dunning introduced David Owen Hastings as our guest speaker for the evening. He is giving his lecture on zoom and hails from Seguim, Washington. He is a graphics designer, and a gallery and textile artist. His goal this evening was to share his passion for modern art, Japanese art, and textiles. David's lecture was divided into 4 parts. He discussed: (1) the very subjective definition of a modern quilt, (2) early influencers, (3) David's inspiration, and (4) and his process to create a modern quilt. He will be teaching his class "Mid Mod Quilts" to the guild this Saturday.

Mary Pauley announced the next Meet Up Bee at Steinhardt Brewery.

Jennifer reported that the July meeting is currently in the planning process for Community Service night. Stay tuned.

Brenda Barnhardt reminded everyone of the guild challenge. There is no minimum size for the guilt, but the maximum is 48" x 48" and must contain buttons and embellishments.

Show & Tell followed. Door prizes were awarded and the fat quarter bundle winner was picked.

Meeting adjourned at 8:40pm.

Cheryl See, a local quilter, will be our in-person guest speaker in June. Cheryl will also be presenting her trunk show.

Cheryl has been quilting since 1993 and started C See's Quilts in 2013. Although Cheryl uses a variety of quilting techniques and styles, she is best known for her handwork, especially with English Paper Piecing. She is often referred to as the "Hexpert" because of her love of hexagon quilts. In 2012, her quilt Star Struck won Best Hand Quilting for a large quilt in Paducah, Kentucky at the American Quilter's Society. Star Struck is now a part of the permanent collection of the National Quilt Museum in Paducah. In the summer of 2013, Cheryl

was the featured artist at the Virginia Quilt Museum for a special exhibit titled "Hexed."
