Second Monday, Sew 'N Sip







Thank you everyone for your continued support and volunteering! Upcoming we have a hand crank handkerchief quilt workshop for kids at the Delaplaine on September 2nd from 1pm - 3pm. We are also looking for volunteers on both September 14 and 24 from 1-4 at Frederick MADE for our 4-part workshop.

Fundraising and Community Service are excited to team up on a new "Buy A Block" initiative. The intention is that members of the guild will make blocks; materials will be available for creating a simple nine-patch block for those who wish to participate. The blocks, once finished, will be sold for \$10 each to create a quilt to be donated to Heartly House at one of their fundraising events on October 21st. The proceeds will be split 50/50 between us and Heartly House.

Kits will be available as cool blocks or warm blocks at the August and September meetings. Above is a draft of the layout: cool blocks will have color in the corners and center, while warm blocks will be the opposite and have white in the corners and center. Each kit will make two blocks.

BUTTONS AND EMBELLISHMENTS

Your entry must include one or more **buttons** PLUS one or more **embellishments** defined but not limited to:

"To make beautiful or elegant by ornaments; to decorate; to adorn."

"A strip of fabric, lace or ribbon tightly gathered or pleated and applied to cloth."

"Beads, sequins or rhinestones applied to fabric to embellish the surface."

The following requirements are as follows:

- 1. A maximum of 48" x 48", any shape.
- 2. 3 layers including batting.
- 3. The entry must be made for or finished for this year's challenge.
