2023 CLUSTERED SPIRES QUILT GUILD CHALLENGE

For our new members, and as a reminder to the rest, we do a challenge each year to exercise your creativity. October 12 is the deadline - It's not too late. The theme chosen by the committee this year is:

BUTTONS AND EMBELLISHMENTS

Your entry must include one or more **buttons PLUS** one or more **embellishments** defined but not limited to:

- "To make beautiful or elegant by ornaments; to decorate; to adorn."
- "A strip of fabric, lace or ribbon tightly gathered or pleated and applied to cloth."
- "Beads, sequins or rhinestones applied to fabric to embellish the surface."

The following requirements are as follows:

- 1. A maximum of 48" x 48", any shape.
- 2. 3 layers including batting.
- 3. The entry must be made for or finished for this year's challenge.

Your entry/entries must be complete to be accepted at the October meeting for judging. First, second and third prizes will be awarded to the top vote getters by the membership. Any questions, contact Julie Howell, Stella Peñalver, Olga Schrichte, Marty Simmons (welcome to the committee Marty!) or Brenda Barnhardt.

October meeting information: Please arrive early if you have an entry so you can drop them off to enter the competition. They will be hung anonymously behind a divider hidden from the rest of the room. When they're ready, everyone will be invited to view



the entries and vote for their favorite. The committee will tally the votes and determine 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners which will be announced after intermission. Those who entered a project will then pick up their entries and Show & Tell them. Gift cards to downtown Frederick shopping will be awarded for \$75, \$50 and \$25 respectively. Regular Show & Tell will follow.


