


## BOM

Once you have completed your 72 blocks it's time to add your borders. The first border will be 1.5 inches wide. The second border will be 2.5 inches. The third border will be the pieced half square triangles which are 2.5 inches. You may decide to only add one border. The choice is yours. Happy sewing.



Second place went to Lidia Borquez with her colorful hummingbird design with weeping flowers.




Next was Daryl MacCrehan's, with a pieced black and white background in medium sized prints with yellow, red and orange poppies appliqued over.

We will likely feature the 2023 Challenge Quilts in our 2024 Delaplaine Quilt Show. Brenda Barnhardt, Chair














Meeting photos... Suma Glassman and Lori Coston from Friendship Star Guild were our guests to sell tickets to their raffle guilt.


