


# CSQG October 2025 BOM



Amish Star



This month we are going to make a scrappy version of the Amish Star block. This is a traditional block usually made with mostly solids but I found a tutorial<sup>1/</sup> by Elaine Huff of *fabric406* where she used scrappy prints to make this block. So fun to make it your own.


Cutting directions for one 12½ inch unfinished block: (all measurements are in inches)

For one block you will:

- Cut from Light/White: 1 - 4½-inch square, 4 - 2½-inch by 4½-inch rectangles, 4 – 3-inch squares, and 8 - 2½-inch squares
- Cut from Assorted Prints: 4 - 2½-inch by 4½-inch rectangles, 4 - 3-inch squares, and 8 - 2½-inch squares


NOTE: All seams are sewn with a scant ¼-inch AND use your favorite method for making units or use the tutorial referenced below.

1. Pair up the Light/White 3-inch squares and the Assorted Prints 3-inch squares, sew together 8 Half Square Triangle (HST) units. Trim/square up the units to 2½ inches.
2. Make four flying geese units with the assorted print 2½-inch by 4½-inch rectangles and the 2½-inch white/light squares.
3. Pair one flying geese unit with one Light/White 2½-inch by 4½-inch rectangle. Press seam allowance toward the Light/White fabric. Make four.




4. Make four corner units. Take two HSTs and two Assorted Prints 2½-inch squares. Sew together like a four patch.

Make 4 of these units.



5. Layout your made units and the 4½-inch square and sew together like a basic nine patch.
6. Trim to 12½ inches square.
