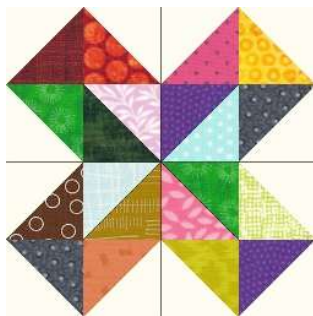




# CSQG November 2025 BOM

## Old Grey Goose (Scrappy Version)



This month we are going to make a scrappy version of the Old Grey Goose block. This is a traditional block usually made with flying geese units, but we are going to make it entirely of half square triangles (HSTs). If you have a bunch of leftover HSTs from other projects, this will be a cinch. So gather up those scraps! If you already have 16 3½-inch HSTs, arrange those according to the diagram below. Otherwise, follow the cutting instructions for making these HSTs from your scraps.

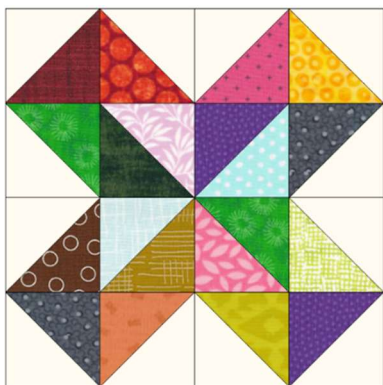
Cutting directions for one 12½ inch unfinished block: (all measurements are in inches)

For one block you will:

- Cut from Light/White: 6 - 4-inch squares
- Cut from Assorted Prints: 10 - 4-inch squares

NOTE: All seams are sewn with a scant ¼-inch.

1. Pair up the Light/White 4-inch squares with 6 of the Assorted Prints 4-inch squares, sew these into 12 Half Square Triangle (HST) units. Trim/square up the units to 3½ inches.
2. Pair up the remaining 4-inch squares using contrasting squares, sew these into 4 HST units. Trim/square up the units to 3½ inches.
3. Arrange the HSTs according to the diagram and sew by rows.



4. Trim to 12½ inches square.
